- Implement clear processes, protocols and expectations for the collection, analysis and use of student data.




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
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


Dryden Central School District 2015-19 Trends and 2023 Targets










Appendix

Mean Growth Percentile (MGP) is a measure of student growth from year to year for similar students from grades 4-8 using a scale from 1-99. A score > 50 means the district is exceeding the average growth of similar students across NYS; a score < 50 means the district is lagging the average growth of similar students across NYS. The MGP is key part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) accountability system. NYSED's rubric for making accountability determinations based on MGP is below.
